1. The number of days school is in session corresponds in boarding schools to the number of days in the quarter, except in the quarters during which school is in vacation, when the average attendance for the actual number of days school is in session shall be regarded as the average attendance for that quarter. In day schools the number corresponds to the number of days in the quarter, less Saturdays, Sundays, and authorized holidays.

2. For the first quarter of the year this inquiry will be blank. For each of the last three quarters this entry will agree with item 4 of the preceding quarter.

3. For the first quarter of the fiscal year this should include all pupils in attendance during any portion of the quarter when school was actually in session. If pupils are carried on the rolls during the vacation period and are dropped before the session opens they should not be included. This also applies to all answers to inquiries in this statement. (See General Instructions for the method of reporting these pupils.)
