



Sir:

Your notice of the temporary employment of Myrtle Freeland as matron at the Uintah school from Nov. 1, 1903, is received. Concerning this service you are informed that Miss Freeland was recently an employee at the Riverside school, California, as you are probably aware, and resigned. Superintendent Hall in forwarding the resignations of Miss Freeland and another employees stated as follows;

"Owing to the epidemic of small pox now raging here, these ladies doubtless became scared and saw fit to leave us. They both wish reinstatement elsewhere, but it would seem that the ones who remain at their post under fire are the ones who should be favored when an advancement offers, and those who desert in time of trouble, it appears to me, should not be recognized in 'fair weather.'"

I concur in the above statements of the Superintendent, and therefore upon receipt of this letter you will relieve Miss Freeland as temporary matron, unless the regular matron arrives in the meanwhile, and you will not reemploy her.


siderable revenue may be derived. In order that the farmers shall not be hampered in their work, they should be relieved as much as possible of all duties not germane to the teaching of agriculture, and you should insist that they spend most of their time visiting the Indians at their homes and farms, where they can observe the methods in vogue and be in a position to continually encourage, advise and aid the Indians how to get the very best results from the limited equipment at hand. One of the largest problems you will have to deal with is to get the Indians to go upon their allotments and actually place them in a state of cultivation. Not only should those Indians who are already making an effort be encouraged, but consistent encouragement should be thrown out to those who have been heretofore inactive, so that they might be brought into the field of activity, and increase their income from the soil, rather than depend entirely upon the irregular labor fund for their support.

The salary of the overseer has been charged against "Indian Moneys, Proceeds of Labor," and the Office will receive your recommendations regarding the expenditure of the \$1200 apportioned for that purpose from "Interest on Ute 5% Fund."
